### Day Camps:

- **Birmingham Community Education Summer Camps** –They offer a variety of 1 week day camp opportunities for children grades 1-8. - **Birmingham YMCA** – The YMCA offers a variety of choices of summer camp opportunities for pre-school aged children through 8<sup>th</sup> grade. ### Overnight/Residential Camps:

- **Camp Copneconic** – Camp Copneconic is a Residential YMCA Camp located in Fenton, Michigan, about an hour north of Birmingham. Camp Copneconic offers summer camp opportunities for youth ages 7-17. They have Adventurers (age 7-entering 4<sup>th</sup> grade), Trailblazers (entering 5<sup>th</sup> grade-7<sup>th</sup> grade), Voyagers (entering 8<sup>th</sup> -10<sup>th</sup> grade) and many more options on their website. - **Camp Ozanam (St. Vincent de Paul Detroit)** – This week-long overnight summer camp is located on the shores of Lake Huron. This is a Christian camp, however campers may choose not to participate in chapel time. Transportation is available from designated locations at no charge. - **Camp Wonder** –Located in Howell, MI within the Howell Nature Center. - ✓ The Camp experience often costs \$275 - \$375 for one week of day camp and \$425 - \$475 for one week of overnight camp.
- ✓ You will be asked to contribute to your child's camp experience based upon your indicated level of income. Approved camp scholarships **will ONLY be paid directly to the camp provider.**
- ✓ Please be aware that **you are responsible for arranging transportation** for your child/children to get to and from camp.
